What does ALC add to your teaching qualification?

ALC supplements initial teaching training with theological units designed to support the teaching of Christian Studies within the cultural and theological context of Lutheran schools.

In addition to their modern educational function, Lutheran schools operate within an historical, cultural and theological context which makes them unique. To be effective teachers in the Lutheran school system, it is important that educators appreciate the culture and theology that underpin Lutheran schools so that they teach consistently with these.

ALC offers units at undergraduate and postgraduate level which assist educators to understand the Lutheran education system and develop their skills as a Christian Studies teacher.

Initial teacher training

Education students at ALC must
be enrolled in or have
completed a state-recognised
teaching degree. Some
institutions will incorporate
ALC units into their teaching
degrees through credit transfer
processes. Pre-service teachers
should approach the
Coordinator of Teacher
Education at their home

institution to ascertain how many ALC units can be credited.

The Lutheran Strand

ALC's initial teacher education program, the Lutheran Strand, is made up of a number of units of study and a professional experience placement in a Lutheran school. It can be taken at either undergraduate or postgraduate level.

Undergraduate Strand

Vocational Certificate

Four units:

- Old Testament Introduction or New Testament Introduction
- · The Christian Faith
- Principles and Context of Lutheran Schooling
- The Practice of Lutheran Education

Most students complete one unit each year for four years and undertake their final professional experience placement in a Lutheran school and teach Christian Studies.

Postgraduate Strand

Graduate Certificate in Teaching Religious Education

Three units:

- Introduction to Lutheran Education
- The Christ-centred School
- Teaching in a Lutheran Education Context

This course can be undertaken either part-time or full-time. It is suitable for students concurrently enrolled in an initial teacher award or in the early part of their career. Students completing concurrent initial teacher training will normally undertake a placement in a Lutheran school which involves teaching Christian Studies.

Modes of study

All Lutheran Strand units are fully online. Many also include opportunities to participate physically or virtually in intensives of up to three days. These normally take place during semester breaks. Students are encouraged to take part in intensives as they enhance student learning outcomes.

Accreditation

The ALC Lutheran Strand program partially completes the requirements for accreditation as a Christian Studies teacher as set down by Lutheran Education Australia (LEA). Graduates complete the rest of the accreditation process once they are teaching in a Lutheran school.

ALC enhances initial teacher training with practical theological preparation to support teachers' work in Lutheran primary and secondary schools.
